Yet the choice of instruments, drawn from both classical and folk traditions, carried implicit cultural politics: the flute, associated with pastoral simplicity, subtly evoked rural Soviet life, while the clarinet's modern edge signaled artistic renewal. The worksheet form, emerging decades later in the 1970s–80s, transformed this performance into a pedagogical scaffold, embedding narrative structure within musical notation to teach phonics, listening comprehension, and emotional intelligence.

The true global expansion of the Peter and the Wolf worksheet began not in theatres, but in classrooms. By the 1980s, as Cold War cultural diplomacy intensified, Prokofiev's work—once confined to Soviet borders—was translated into dozens of languages, each version adapted not just linguistically, but culturally. In Poland, the wolf became a metaphor for post-war political oppression; in Japan, the narrative emphasized harmony and restraint; in Brazil, the instrumentation incorporated regional folk instruments like
