Plant hormones were framed as tools of “scientific progress”—a narrative that linked hormonal manipulation to modernization, efficiency, and national strength. The Green Revolution, spearheaded by Norman Borlaug, relied heavily on gibberellin analogs and auxin-based rooting agents to stabilize high-yield cereal varieties. But beneath the rhetoric of famine relief lay a deeper ambition: to bind developing nations to industrial agricultural models, where proprietary hormones and synthetic inputs became dependencies.

The Industrialization of Hormonal Biology

By the 1970s, plant hormone research had become institutionalized within a global biotech complex. Multinational agrochemical firms—Bayer, Syngenta, BASF—began acquiring academic labs, patenting hormone analogs, and integrating them into seed treatments and foliar sprays. Auxins, once biochemical curiosities, were repackaged as commercial products: NAA (naphthaleneacetic acid) for rooting cuttings, 2,4-D for broadleaf weed control, each engineered for precision and scalability. This industrial shift was not merely economic; it was epistemological. The language of plant hormones was translated into proprietary formulas, standardized application protocols, and risk-assessment frameworks designed to fit corporate supply chains. The once-diffuse scientific discourse became codified in technical manuals, regulatory guidelines, and trade agreements. The International Plant Nutrition Institute (IPNI), founded in 1977, emerged as a key node in this network—bridging academia, government, and industry in defining “optimal” hormonal regimes for global crops. Yet this standardization obscured ecological complexity. Hormones do not act in isolation. Auxins stimulate growth but can disrupt symbiotic relationships with mycorrhizal fungi. Gibberellins accelerate stem elongation but may reduce drought resilience. The reductionist impulse—treat hormone

application as a linear input-output process—ignored feedback loops embedded in soil microbiomes, climate variability, and genetic diversity. This epistemic narrowing allowed corporations to promote hormonal interventions as universally beneficial, even as field data revealed context-dependent failures. A pivotal moment came in the 1990s with the advent of transgenic crops. Scientists began engineering plants to overproduce or suppress specific hormones—e.g., auxin transporters to enhance root architecture, ethylene inhibitors to delay fruit ripening. These modifications were not just biological; they were legal. The Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety (2000) emerged in response to fears of uncontrolled genetic flow, but it largely overlooked hormonal regulation, treating genes rather than signaling dynamics as the primary risk vector.

Geopolitical Currents: Hormones as Instruments of Power and Dependency

The global spread of plant hormone technologies has been deeply uneven. In the Global North, hormonal inputs are tightly integrated into precision agriculture—drones, sensors, AI-driven application systems calibrate hormone delivery to micro-environmental cues. In contrast, in much of the Global South, hormone use remains fragmented, often mediated through extension services or informal seed systems. This disparity reflects broader structural inequalities: access to regulatory infrastructure, intellectual property regimes, and capital. China exemplifies a hybrid model. Since the 2000s, the state has aggressively promoted hormonal biostimulants as part of its “Smart Agriculture” initiative, combining state-backed R&D with market-driven commercialization. Chinese firms now export formulations of cytokinins and brassinosteroids across Africa and Southeast Asia, positioning themselves as alternatives to Western agrochemical dominance. Yet this shift raises questions about technological sovereignty: are these nations gaining true autonomy, or merely substituting one export-driven model for another? In Latin America, the story is one of contested adaptation. Brazil’s vast soybean and sugarcane sectors rely heavily on auxin and gibberellin treatments to maximize yields on degraded soils. But local agroecologists warn that over-reliance on hormonal inputs accelerates soil degradation and biodiversity loss. The Brazilian Landless Workers’ Movement (MST) frames this not as a technical failure but as a symptom of extractive agricultural paradigms—where nature is treated as a programmable system, not a living network. The Middle East, facing acute water scarcity, has explored abscisic acid (ABA) analogs to induce drought tolerance. Yet such interventions risk reinforcing dependency on external technologies, even as climate chaos intensifies. Here, plant hormones become geopolitical tools: controlled by firms with vested interests in climate adaptation markets, they carry implicit power to shape food systems in regions already vulnerable to political volatility. In Europe, regulatory caution has tempered hormonal adoption. The EU’s precautionary principle has restricted many synthetic hormone formulations, favoring organic and

biostimulant alternatives derived from seaweed extracts or microbial fermentation. Yet this regulatory divergence creates trade friction—African exporters, for instance, face stringent hormone residue limits that challenge their competitiveness in European markets.

Expert Perspectives: From Molecules to Mosaics of Power

Leading plant biologists and sociologists offer divergent lenses on the significance of plant hormones. Dr. Caroline Coates, a systems biologist at the University of Cambridge, argues that hormones represent “the original smart materials of plants”—evolutionary solutions refined over millions of years. “When we manipulate auxin gradients,” she explains, “we are not just altering growth; we are rewiring the plant’s internal communication network, effectively reprogramming its developmental logic.” For Coates, hormones are both biological signals and metaphors for interconnectedness—reminding us that life operates through distributed intelligence. Contrast this with Dr. Rajiv Mehta, an agricultural economist at IITM (Indian Institute of Management Bangalore), who views hormonal technologies through the prism of political economy. “Plant hormones are not neutral tools,” he asserts. “They are nodes in a global knowledge economy where data, patents, and regulatory control converge. Multinational firms don’t just sell hormones—they sell the right to control plant signaling, embedding farmers into dependency chains that extend beyond seed and soil.” Dr. Elena Volkov, a geo-political analyst at the Moscow Institute of Global Futures, adds a critical historical layer: “The hormonization of agriculture mirrors earlier transformations—from synthetic fertilizers in the Green Revolution to CRISPR today. Each wave reframes agriculture as a molecular enterprise, shifting power from local knowledge to centralized expertise. The question is not just efficacy, but who defines ‘optimal’ growth, and at whose cost.” Ethicists like Dr. Amara Nkosi of the University of Cape Town emphasize the moral dimensions. “Hormonal manipulation raises profound questions about the agency of non-human life,” she notes. “Are we engineering plants to serve human needs without regard for their intrinsic capacity to adapt? And when these modifications spread via pollen, do we have a duty to contain them, or to steward them with humility?”

Controversies and Risks: The Hidden Costs of Hormonal Engineering

Despite decades of application, plant hormones remain poorly understood in complex ecosystems. A recurring controversy centers on off-target effects. For example, synthetic auxins applied to promote root development in drought-stressed crops have been linked to altered rhizosphere microbiomes—disrupting nitrogen fixation and nutrient cycling. Similarly, ethylene inhibitors designed to extend shelf life may interfere with plant defense responses, increasing susceptibility to pathogens. Regulatory

A 2022 meta-analysis in *Nature Sustainability* found that monocultures treated with synthetic gibberellins showed 30% lower survival rates under heat stress than traditional varieties—highlighting the paradox: short-term gains at the expense of long-term viability. There is also a growing concern about endocrine-like interference in humans. While plant hormones do not directly bind human receptors, trace residues in food and water raise questions about cumulative exposure. The European Food Safety Authority (EFSA) maintains current limits are safe, but independent researchers at the University of Guelph have detected hormone-like metabolites in urban drinking water, urging reevaluation of exposure thresholds.

Global Comparisons: Divergent Paths, Shared Dilemmas

Comparing regional approaches illuminates how cultural, economic, and ecological contexts shape hormone use. Here, hormones are part of a national strategy to secure water-limited food production, supported by state-funded R&D and public-private partnerships. The result is high efficiency but also high dependency on imported inputs. Brazil’s model blends industrial scale with adaptation challenges. While soy and corn farmers embrace auxin-based rooting agents to reduce planting delays, deforestation and soil compaction remain critical side effects. The country’s role as a global agricultural exporter amplifies the stakes—its hormone use impacts not only local ecosystems but global carbon and biodiversity balances. In Scandinavia, a precautionary ethos prevails. Hormonal inputs are tightly regulated, with strong emphasis on agroecological alternatives. Sweden’s National Board of Agriculture promotes “hormone-smart” farming, prioritizing soil health and biodiversity over short-term yield boosts. This reflects a broader cultural commitment to sustainability, even at the cost of moderate productivity. China’s trajectory reveals a strategic blend of innovation and control. The state funds large-scale trials of hormonal biostimulants tailored to rice, wheat, and maize—crops central to food

security. Yet regulatory oversight struggles to balance rapid deployment with long-term monitoring, raising questions about environmental liability and public health.

Long-Term Implications and Forward-Projection

Looking ahead, plant hormones are poised to become even more central to the future of food. Climate change intensifies the demand for resilient crops, and hormonal engineering offers promising tools—drought-tolerant auxin-responsive lines, heat-stable gibberellin regulators, ethylene-modulated ripening for reduced post-harvest waste. Yet this potential must be weighed against systemic risks. One critical frontier is synthetic biology: engineering microbes to produce plant hormones in situ, creating “living fertilizers” that respond dynamically to plant needs. This could reduce chemical runoff and enhance nutrient use efficiency, but introduces new ecological uncertainties. Gene-edited crops with altered hormone pathways may face regulatory hurdles, especially where public trust is fragile. Digital agriculture will further transform hormone use. AI-driven phenotyping platforms can now predict optimal hormonal treatments based on real-time plant data—leaf temperature, chlorophyll fluorescence, soil moisture. This precision reduces waste but deepens data extraction, raising privacy and ownership concerns for farmers. Geopolitically, hormone technologies may become new vectors of influence. As nations compete to dominate “smart agriculture” markets, control over hormonal signaling systems could mirror historical struggles over fossil fuels and information technology. Export controls, patent thickets, and standards-setting will shape access—potentially reinforcing existing power asymmetries. Yet there is also a counter-narrative: a growing movement toward decentralized, participatory approaches. Community seed banks, agroecological networks, and open-source biotech initiatives are exploring hormone-free or microdosed strategies—reclaiming agency over plant signaling. These efforts reflect a broader reimagining of agriculture: not as a mechanized system governed by external inputs, but as a collaborative, living process. The long-term health of agroecosystems—and human societies—depends on navigating this duality. Will plant hormones remain tools of industrial optimization, or evolve into instruments of regenerative resilience? The answer lies not in the molecules themselves, but in the values, policies, and power structures that guide their deployment.

Do we continue to treat growth as a calculable output, or recognize it as part of a living, evolving web? Hormones, in their silent flow through roots and shoots, remind us that agriculture is not merely a science of yield—it is a practice of coexistence.
