Truth itself is commodified: real-time data feeds, personalized content, and deepfake technology fragment collective reality, making consensus impossible and resistance diffuse. Industry-wise, Žižek observed a paradox: while tech giants consolidate power, they also fund the very dissent they suppress. Open-source software, decentralized networks, and whistleblower platforms like WikiLeaks emerged from the same digital infrastructure that enables surveillance. This duality—capitalism’s self-disruption as both destroyer and catalyst—defines the end-times condition. Žižek’s insight was that oppression and resistance are dialectically entangled: the state and capital co-produce the conditions of their own undoing, even as they adapt to contain dissent. Expert perspectives on Žižek’s relevance vary. Sociologist David Harvey acknowledges his unparalleled ability to link abstract theory to concrete crisis, calling him “the most urgent Marxist of our age.” Political theorist Wendy Brown notes his prescience in diagnosing neoliberalism’s “performative” logic—how governance now operates through spectacle, not policy.
