A 2023 feasibility study estimated a \$42 million capital investment needed over ten years to upgrade classrooms, construct climate-resilient buildings, and expand broadband access. While state grants and federal Title I funds provide partial support, the district must pursue public-private partnerships, particularly with energy-sector companies and agricultural cooperatives seeking skilled local talent. Pilot programs in solar-powered classrooms and mobile STEM labs—already tested in neighboring counties—offer low-risk entry points. Curricular innovation must follow. The district should pilot blended learning models during favorable seasons, using summer months for project-based learning and digital skill-building—aligning with agricultural cycles rather than resisting them. For instance, students could engage in environmental science projects monitoring local aquifers, integrating math, biology, and civic engagement. Dual enrollment with community colleges should be expanded, even if only through short-term certifications, to provide pathways to vocational training and higher education. Equity must be central: targeted summer academies, transportation support for migrant students, and multilingual resources will close persistent gaps. Community co-creation is
