In 19th-century Egypt, under Ottoman influence but with a distinct medical identity, cupping evolved into a public practice taught in folk healing schools (*madrasas al-tibbiya*), where itinerant *hijjāj* (cuppers) offered services ranging from minor ailments to postpartum recovery. The practice adapted fluidly—absorbing elements of Sufi healing rituals, Ayurvedic breathwork (*prāṇāyāma*), and even Chinese acupuncture’s meridian theory—creating a hybridized form that emphasized both physical and energetic restoration. The 20th century witnessed a paradoxical trajectory: while Western biomedicine gained dominance in the Global North, hijama persisted and thrived in regions with strong traditional medicine infrastructures, particularly the Middle East, North Africa, and parts of South Asia. In Saudi Arabia, Egypt, and the UAE, hijama became institutionalized within public health frameworks, especially in rural areas where access to primary care was limited. Here, the therapy was not merely complementary but often primary—delivered by licensed *hijjājs* operating in clinics, mosques, and even street corners. The modern global resurgence began in the early 2000s, catalyzed by diasporic communities in Europe, North America, and Australia seeking culturally resonant healthcare. Ahmad Hijama, a British-trained physician of Palestinian descent, emerged as a pivotal figure in this renaissance. His approach, branded under Hijama Therapy, fused classical cupping with principles of vacuum-assisted therapy, anatomy, and evidence-based protocols—positioning it as a “scientific” alternative to pharmaceuticals. Hijama’s clinical demonstrations, particularly in treating migraines, chronic pain, and stress-related disorders, attracted both media attention and clinical scrutiny. Economically, hijama therapy has evolved into a multi-billion-dollar niche within integrative medicine. In the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) countries, the market is projected to exceed \$1.2 billion by 2030, driven by government-backed wellness initiatives, medical tourism, and a growing middle class seeking non-Western healthcare options. Ahmad Hijama’s brand, supported by a network of clinics, certification programs, and digital platforms, exemplifies a new model of traditional medicine commodification—where ancestry, spirituality, and clinical efficacy are marketed as a holistic lifestyle brand. This commercialization, however, has intensified debates over standardization, regulation, and authenticity. While hijama’s roots are deeply spiritual and ritualistic, its modern clinical framing often strips away symbolic elements—such as the invocation of divine protection or the use of specific ritual vessels—reframing it as a biomechanical intervention. This shift has enabled broader acceptance in Western integrative health circles but raised concerns among traditional practitioners about dilution of cultural integrity.

Expert Perspectives: Medical, Scientific, and Cultural Validations and Skepticism

The professional medical community’s engagement with Ahmad Hijama therapy reflects a spectrum of cautious interest, methodological rigor, and persistent skepticism. From a clinical standpoint, hijama’s core mechanism—localized vacuum cupping—has been studied through biomechanical models. Proponents argue that localized negative pressure enhances microcirculation, reduces inflammation, and promotes

lymphatic drainage—effects supported by small-scale studies showing improved pain markers and reduced cortisol levels post-treatment. A 2018 randomized controlled trial conducted at King Saud University evaluated hijama's efficacy in treating tension headaches. Participants receiving eight sessions demonstrated a 42% reduction in headache frequency over 12 weeks, compared to 21% in the control group. The study noted significant improvements in sleep quality and anxiety scores, suggesting a neurophysiological impact beyond placebo. However, methodological limitations—small sample size, short duration, and lack of blinding—curtailed definitive conclusions. Critical to the debate is the absence of large, multi-center trials that meet international standards for therapeutic validation. While some studies report statistically significant outcomes, the broader medical consensus remains noncommittal. The American College of Physicians, for instance, does not endorse cupping as a first-line treatment, citing insufficient evidence for efficacy and potential risks. From a traditional medicine perspective, hijama's legitimacy rests on its adherence to **ṭibb al-nabawī** (Prophetic medicine)—a body of knowledge rooted in Islamic tradition and historical practice. Practitioners like Dr. Yusuf Al-Qaradawi, a leading scholar in Islamic health ethics, affirm that cupping, when performed with proper hygiene and intent, aligns with Islamic principles of healing and compassion. Yet, tensions arise when commercialization prioritizes profit over spiritual context, leading to accusations of cultural appropriation and medicalization of sacred ritual. Culturally, hijama occupies a liminal space: revered in communities with deep-rooted healing traditions, yet viewed with suspicion by biomedical elites. In Egypt, for example, elite medical associations have issued guidelines cautioning against unregulated practice, emphasizing the need for formal training and adherence to sterilization protocols. Conversely, in the UAE, hijama clinics are accredited within national health networks, reflecting institutional acceptance. This duality—spiritual authenticity versus clinical validation—defines the therapy's contested identity. Ahmad Hijama himself navigates this tension by positioning his practice as “scientific hijama,” integrating anatomical precision with ancestral wisdom. His clinics offer both traditional **hijama** (using glass cups and ritual incantations) and “medical hijama,” employing vacuum pumps and evidence-based protocols—effectively bifurcating the practice into culturally authentic and clinically certified domains.

Risks, Controversies, and Safety Concerns in Clinical Practice

Despite its growing popularity, Ahmad Hijama therapy is not without significant risks and controversies, particularly when practiced outside regulated environments or without proper training. The most immediate concern is the potential for infection, skin damage, and vascular injury. Traditional cupping relies on glass or silicone cups applied to the skin for 5–15 minutes, creating localized suction. When improperly executed—using unsterilized equipment, excessive suction, or repeated sessions—it can lead to bruising, blistering, or even secondary infection, especially in immunocompromised individuals or those with clotting disorders. A 2021 analysis published in **BMC Complementary Medicine and Therapies** reviewed 127 adverse event reports from GCC healthcare systems. Among them, 38% were linked to cupping practices, with 12% involving severe complications: one case of septicemia following unsterilized cup use, another resulting in permanent nerve damage due to deep cupping near major blood vessels. These incidents underscore the critical importance of hygiene, practitioner training, and patient screening. Regulatory fragmentation exacerbates the risk. In Saudi Arabia and the UAE, hijama is licensed under national health authorities, with formal certification programs and standardized protocols. In contrast, in many Western countries—including the U.S. and most of Europe—cupping falls into a gray zone. It is often classified as a “complementary therapy” without standardized licensure, allowing unregulated

practitioners to operate under minimal oversight. This discrepancy fuels international patient mobility, with individuals seeking hijama in Middle Eastern clinics, only to face complications upon returning to countries with stricter medical liability laws. Another controversy centers on diagnostic overreach. Some practitioners, particularly those aligned with Ahmad Hijama's model, claim cupping can diagnose internal imbalances—such as liver or kidney dysfunction—based on color changes in residual blood. While traditional practitioners historically made such assessments, modern clinicians warn that visual cues alone are insufficient and can lead to misdiagnosis, delaying conventional treatment. Ethical concerns also arise around informed consent. In commercial settings, particularly in wellness tourism hubs, cupping is often marketed as a “detox” or “spiritual cleanse,” with promises of extended wellness benefits unsupported by science. Patients may be pressured into multiple sessions under the guise of holistic care, without full disclosure of risks or evidence base. This commercial framing risks exploiting vulnerable populations—elderly individuals, chronic pain sufferers, or those disillusioned with conventional medicine.

Global Comparisons: Hijama in the Context of Alternative and Traditional Healing Systems

Ahmad Hijama's model must be understood within a broader global landscape of traditional healing systems undergoing modernization. Unlike acupuncture—whose integration into Western medicine has been facilitated by decades of clinical research and standardized training—hijama's path has been shaped by cultural continuity, religious identity, and postcolonial medical resilience. In China, cupping shares a conceptual root with moxibustion and acupuncture but has evolved separately within Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM). While moxibustion involves burning mugwort near acupuncture points, hijama focuses on negative-pressure extraction, yet both aim to regulate *qi* flow. Both practices have seen state-sanctioned integration into public health: TCM hospitals in Beijing and hijama clinics in Dubai both operate under national health frameworks, though with distinct epistemological foundations. In India, *sirah qalqash* (cupping) exists in Ayurvedic and Unani traditions, often combined with herbal oils and dietary regimens. Unlike hijama's vacuum method, these rely on heat application and gentle suction, emphasizing humoral balance (*doshas*) rather than blood dynamics. The key divergence lies in intent: hijama in the Arab world frequently carries spiritual connotations—protection, purification—whereas Indian cupping is primarily physiological. Japan's *hijun* (cupping), influenced by Chinese medicine, uses glass cups but emphasizes gentle therapy for musculoskeletal issues, aligning with *shinrin* (forest bathing) and holistic wellness trends. Here, cupping is more frequently medicalized than ritualistic, reflecting a cultural preference for subtlety and non-invasive care. In contrast, Western integrative medicine has adopted cupping selectively—often as a niche therapy within chiropractic or sports medicine clinics—where it is framed as a biomechanical intervention rather than a spiritual or cultural practice. This contrasts sharply with hijama's embeddedness in identity, religion, and communal care, particularly in Muslim-majority societies. This global variation reveals a fundamental tension: can hijama retain its cultural and spiritual essence when transplanted into secular, biomedical contexts? Ahmad Hijama's brand attempts to mediate this by emphasizing “scientific hijama,” but critics argue this dilutes its authenticity. The therapy's future depends on whether it can navigate this duality—honoring tradition while meeting modern standards of safety, transparency, and evidence.

Long-Term Implications and Strategic Projections for Hijama Therapy

Looking ahead, Ahmad Hijama therapy stands at a crossroads defined by demographic shifts, technological innovation, and evolving healthcare paradigms. Such tools could democratize access, particularly for diasporic communities lacking in-person practitioners. Yet, this digital expansion risks further commodification. As hijama becomes a branded lifestyle product, the line between authentic healing and consumerism blurs. Strategic foresight demands regulatory harmonization: international standards for practitioner certification, equipment sterilization, and adverse event reporting. Collaboration between Islamic medical councils, WHO, and national health ministries could establish a global framework that preserves cultural integrity while ensuring safety. Economically, hijama’s trajectory mirrors broader trends in the wellness economy—valued at over \$1.3 trillion globally, projected to reach \$1.8 trillion by 2025. Ahmad Hijama’s model exemplifies a new archetype: traditional healers evolving into health entrepreneurs, leveraging heritage as a competitive advantage. Governments in the Middle East are already investing in hijama academies, research grants, and tourism campaigns, positioning the therapy as a soft power asset and cultural export. Clinically, the path forward hinges on rigorous research. Large-scale, multi-ethnic RCTs are urgently needed to validate efficacy across conditions like chronic fatigue, PTSD, and post-surgical recovery. Parallel investments in biomechanical modeling—using fMRI and circulatory mapping—could elucidate the neurophysiological mechanisms behind cupping’s effects, bridging ancient practice with modern science. Culturally, hijama’s resilience depends on
