The difference now is scale and sophistication: bones are no longer relics but feedstocks for a \$12B+ biomanufacturing sector.' Forensic anthropologists warn that unregulated extraction risks contaminating archaeological records and violating ethical boundaries, particularly when remains belong to marginalized or conflict-affected communities. Controversies surrounding the Bone People are both moral and legal.
