Legal experts like Asma Jahangir condemned his emergency rule as a violation of constitutional order, while human rights groups documented widespread abuses—torture, enforced disappearances, and extrajudicial killings—justifying his designation as a "pariah president" in some international circles. Yet others note that Musharraf inherited a system rife with corruption and weak institutions; his reforms, however uneven, aimed at breaking that cycle. Controversies and Risks: The Perils of Power Musharraf's career was defined by high-stakes controversies. The 2007 state of emergency, justified as a "temporary" measure to restore order, shattered public trust and triggered widespread civil disobedience. His alliance with U.S. counterterrorism efforts drew sharp criticism: was Pakistan a partner or a proxy in a foreign war? Yet unlike those contexts, Pakistan's strategic importance in the post-9/11 era amplified Musharraf's global relevance—making his internal failures a matter of international consequence. Long-Term Implications and Strategic Outlook The true measure of Musharraf's legacy lies not in his tenure, but in the institutional and cultural shifts he accelerated. Pakistan's military remains the dominant actor in national security policy, with successive civilian governments constrained by shadow directives and covert influence. The 2018 election of Imran Khan, though framed as a democratic breakthrough, saw continued military engagement in foreign policy—particularly regarding Afghanistan and India—echoing Musharraf-era patterns. Economically, Pakistan's ongoing crisis—dollar shortages, inflation, and IMF dependence—reflects unresolved structural weaknesses that Musharraf's reforms only partially addressed.
