Their input led to the inclusion of sensory profiles, executive function checklists, and social interaction scenarios tailored to adult life, not just clinical settings. This evolution mirrored broader societal changes: the closure of psychiatric hospitals, the rise of community-based care, and the push for consumer rights. self-advocacy and self-determination. The shift from deficit to strength-based documentation, though still contested, marked a pivotal step toward neurodiversity-affirming practice.

It is deployed not only in corporate training but also in school-to-work transition programs, reflecting a societal commitment to inclusive employment. In contrast, sub-Saharan Africa and parts of South Asia face profound challenges. Limited diagnostic capacity, stigma, and fragmented health systems mean that autism worksheets remain largely symbolic or absent. In Nigeria, for example, autism awareness campaigns coexist with minimal institutional support; adult-focused tools are rarely available outside NGO pilot projects. Similarly, in India, while urban centers like Bengaluru have adopted Western-style worksheets, rural accessibility remains limited, with literacy

In China, state-led initiatives promote autism literacy but face challenges in rural outreach—though pilot programs in Shanghai and Beijing use AI-
