Beyond physical design, the rete has found new life in computational domains. Computer graphics engines use polygonal similarity to render high-fidelity, scalable environments—critical for video games, virtual reality, and simulation training. In machine learning, convolutional neural networks (CNNs) implicitly exploit similarity through hierarchical feature extraction, akin to scaling invariants.
