Real-time collaboration tools, secure data-sharing protocols, and AI-assisted research assistants—integrated into its framework—enable faster, safer, and more inclusive investigation. As generative AI evolves, the Plan's emphasis on human oversight and ethical guardrails offers a model for responsible innovation.
