Their ability to optimize routes in real time, use electric vehicles to cut fuel costs, and integrate seamlessly with e-commerce APIs has eroded the competitive edge of public postal services. The rise of same-day and next-day delivery expectations has further strained Australia Post's capacity. While competitors absorb peak costs through dynamic pricing and surge staffing, the national carrier's universal mandate limits its ability to adjust rates rapidly or drop unprofitable routes. This imbalance has led to public debate over whether universal service obligations should be reformed—potentially through cross-subsidization or government risk-sharing—to ensure sustainability without sacrificing equity.

Expert analysis underscores a fundamental dilemma: maintaining universal postal access in a digital age demands capital-intensive infrastructure, yet the declining volume basis makes ROI elusive. The OECD has flagged Australia's postal cost per parcel as among the highest in the developed world—nearly double that of Germany or the Netherlands—driven by low density, high labor costs, and legacy systems.
