The U.S. Inflation Reduction Act and China's 14th Five-Year Plan both include blue economy components, illustrating how oceanic strategy is now embedded in national development plans. Military geography remains inseparable from economic imperatives. The U.S. Indo-Pacific Command (INDOPACOM) prioritizes sea control to sustain trade and deter coercion. Russia's Black Sea Fleet bases support projective power in Europe; China's naval expansion includes artificial island construction in the South China Sea, enabling surveillance and missile deployment. Undersea warfare, once niche, is now central: fiber-optic cables—carrying 95% of intercontinental data—are vulnerable to sabotage, prompting nations to invest in maritime domain awareness and underwater defense. The 2021 undersea cable cut near Madagascar, disrupting internet access across Africa and India, underscored this vulnerability. Climate change intensifies these dynamics. Sea-level rise threatens coastal infrastructure—Miami, Shanghai, Lagos—and displaces populations,

creating climate migrants who strain maritime borders. Arctic warming opens new shipping routes, such as the Northern Sea Route, reducing voyage times between Asia and Europe by weeks but raising concerns over environmental damage and sovereignty disputes. The U.S. National Security Strategy identifies climate-driven maritime instability as a top threat, demanding integrated defense, diplomacy, and development responses.

Expert Perspectives: From Continental Boundaries to Oceanic Futures

Contemporary scholars and policymakers emphasize the evolving relationship between continents, oceans, and human agency. Dr. Jane Lubchenco, former NOAA administrator and marine ecologist, argues that “oceans are not just resources but life support systems—we must manage them as integrated, dynamic entities rather than isolated domains.” Her work underscores the need for transboundary cooperation, especially in fisheries management and marine protected areas.
