Sanskrit’s morphological complexity, with its system of roots, affixes, and inflections, allowed for unparalleled precision in expressing nuance. Its role extended beyond religion: the *Sulba Sutras* encoded early geometry; the *Charaka Samhita* detailed Ayurvedic medicine; and astronomical treatises like *Aryabhatiya* advanced mathematics and astronomy. As a liturgical and scholarly language, Sanskrit functioned as a unifying medium across vast linguistic and regional divides, enabling intellectual coherence across kingdoms and dynasties, from the Mauryas to the Chalukyas. Its decline began with the arrival of regional languages in daily life and later with colonial suppression—British administrators and missionaries often dismissed it as obsolete, accelerating its marginalization in public education.

immersion. Learners study thematic lexicons—ritual terms, poetic
