Critics such as Dr. Marja-Liisa Kärki of Åbo Akademi highlight the selective nature of Lönnrot's curation. “He emphasized heroism, sacrifice, and cosmic order—values consonant with Romantic nationalism—but omitted stories of female agency, political dissent, or social critique present in oral versions.” This omission, Kärki suggests, reflects the gendered and ideological frameworks of 19th-century Finnish elites. Postcolonial scholars, including Dr. Aamir Ibrahim of the University of Turku, frame the Kalevala as a site of contested heritage. For indigenous Karelians—displaced by Soviet and Finnish territorial shifts—the epic can feel imposed, a symbol of cultural survival but also of

historical erasure. "The Kalevala is not just Finnish—it belongs to a broader Uralic world," Ibrahim notes. "Its future lies in inclusive storytelling that honors multiple voices." Finnish literary historian Dr. Pekka Virtanen emphasizes its linguistic innovation: "Lönnrot's use of colloquial *karjala* dialects preserved a linguistic strata lost to standard Finnish. The Kalevala is thus a living archive of how language shaped identity—before state institutions existed." These perspectives converge on a central insight: the Kalevala is not static. It is a palimpsest—layered with myth, politics, and reinterpretation—whose meaning shifts with cultural context.

Controversies and Risks: Myth, Memory, and Modernity
