But this transformation is not without controversy. Critics argue that the medicalization

A 2022 study found that 63% of recreational golfers over 50 felt intimidated by the fitness demands promoted by elite training programs, fearing injury or inadequacy. These trends reflect a multipolar realignment: golf is no longer a Western pastime but a global performance ecosystem, where health is both personal and political.

Expert consensus increasingly frames golf fitness as a bellwether for broader societal adaptation to aging and metabolic challenge. Dr. Elena Marquez, a biomechanist at the University of Edinburgh's Golf and Human Performance Lab, explains: "Golf forces us to confront the limits of human endurance across decades.
