The 2023 reforms mandating spousal consent for under-18 marriages and digitized registration in Karachi’s municipal courts represent incremental progress, but systemic change demands deeper reform—legal, educational, and cultural. This commercialization, while expanding access, risks reducing a sacred contract to a transactional performance—particularly among the urban middle

class, where marriage has become a high-stakes social investment. Expert analysis reveals a growing tension between legal reform and lived practice. Dr. Saba Mehmin, professor of gender studies at LUMS, notes: 'The *nikah nama* is not failing—it is being failed, institutionally and socially. The law exists, but its implementation is fragmented. Women's legal awareness lags behind legal provisions. Courts are overburdened, and many rural women lack literacy in their own rights.' Similarly, Dr. Amir Qureshi of the Pakistan Institute of Legislative Development emphasizes that true reform requires not just updating the *nikah nama*'s text, but transforming the social contract—challenging norms around honor, consent, and gendered power. Controversies surround the very definition of *nikah nama*. What constitutes a valid contract? Does oral recitation suffice, or must it be written and registered? In 2020, the Supreme Court of Pakistan ruled that oral *nikah* contracts lack enforceability in family courts unless formally registered—sparking backlash from conservative clerics who labeled it *bid'ah* (innovation contrary to tradition). Yet this ruling underscores a critical flaw: the incentive to bypass formal channels leads to hidden unions, financial exploitation, and contested inheritances. The tension between *sharia* as spiritual

ideal and **sharia** as legal system remains unresolved. Globally, Pakistan's **nikah nama** contrasts with marriage contract models elsewhere. In Iran, **nikah** is a civil and religious contract with strict gender segregation and male guardianship. In Turkey, post-1926 secular reforms abolished religious marriage, replacing it with state-registered civil unions. In the Gulf, **nikah** is administered by religious courts with strict gender separations. In contrast, Pakistan's system retains religious authority within a state framework—neither fully secular nor theocratic. This hybrid model reflects broader struggles in post-colonial Muslim-majority states: balancing religious identity with modern governance. Looking forward, the **nikah nama** stands at a crossroads. Demographic shifts—youth comprising 60% of Pakistan's population—demand greater legal transparency and digital inclusion. Yet without parallel social reforms—expanding girls' education, empowering women's legal literacy, and challenging communal narratives—progress will remain superficial.
