The geopolitical dimensions are profound. In fragile states, weak governance and conflict zones provide fertile ground for criminal syndicates. In places like Myanmar, where military junta control over natural resources is contested, bird trafficking becomes a low-risk, high-reward enterprise. In contrast, nations with robust environmental agencies—such as Costa Rica or South Africa—struggle to contain cross-border flows, revealing that even strong institutions are outmaneuvered by organized networks.
