In Scandinavia, where high trust in institutions coexists with robust accountability mechanisms, empty horse rhetoric is met with skepticism tempered by engagement. Nordic citizens demand evidence; when promises falter, they mobilize through civil society, leveraging transparency laws and media oversight. In contrast, in emerging democracies like Brazil or Nigeria, where institutional memory is fragile and public trust low, empty horse promises often resonate more deeply—especially

when tied to immediate material needs. Here, performance is not just symbolic but survivalist: leaders who deliver clinics, roads, or digital access gain legitimacy, even if long-term sustainability is questionable. China’s model offers a distinct variant. The state’s emphasis on “delivery” (shua) has historically grounded legitimacy in tangible outcomes—poverty reduction, infrastructure expansion. Yet, recent local protests over pollution, ghost cities, and labor rights reveal that even in one-party systems, empty horse expectations persist. When growth lags or crises emerge, the narrative shifts from “we are building the future” to “we failed to keep our promises,” exposing the same vulnerability. The Middle East presents another layer.
