These efforts, though modest in scale, signal a shift toward circular economies where long-term stewardship replaces extractive urgency. As global demand for traceable, low-impact seafood rises—driven by EU and U.S. import regulations—Zorn's network could become a de facto standard for compliance-integrated fisheries. Culturally, Zorn embodies a quiet reclamation of agency in an industry increasingly dominated by processors, retailers, and algorithmic trading.
