Ganguly, in his seminal works, emphasizes that this period marked a quiet but critical inflection point—a recognition that survival in a multipolar world required not just neutrality, but active engagement. The 1991 economic liberalization acted as a catalyst, transforming India from a closed developmental state into a market-driven actor with global economic stakes. For Ganguly, this shift was not merely economic but deeply geopolitical: economic integration demanded diplomatic flexibility. India's foreign policy, he argues, began to reflect a dual logic—economic pragmatism paired with strategic autonomy. The rise of China as a regional hegemon, the persistent uncertainty of U.S. commitment, and the resurgence of Russia as a counterweight forced India to reconsider its traditional balancing act. Ganguly documents how New Delhi, under Prime Ministers Narasimha Rao and later Manmohan Singh, began to pursue what he terms "pragmatic sovereignty"—a doctrine that prioritizes national

interest over ideological consistency, even when it means recalibrating long-standing alliances. The geopolitical context of the 2000s deepened this recalibration. China's assertiveness in the Himalayas, its Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) penetrating South Asia, and the U.S. "pivot to Asia" created a complex strategic matrix. Ganguly underscores that India's foreign policy pivot toward the Indo-Pacific was not an abrupt reversal but a logical extension of its historical maritime consciousness—reclaimed from colonial neglect. The formulation of the Indo-Pacific concept in Indian policy, particularly under the Modi government, reflects a return to a strategic geography that had long been marginalized. Ganguly analyzes this as a civilizational reawakening—India reclaiming its role not as a regional actor, but as a maritime power shaping the rules of engagement. Yet this ambition is not without internal contradictions. Ganguly meticulously traces the tension between India's democratic ethos and the demands of realpolitik. The country's foreign policy, while increasingly strategic, remains constrained by domestic political cycles, bureaucratic inertia, and a civil society that often resists what it perceives as realpolitik compromises—most evident in public backlash over ties with authoritarian neighbors or opaque defense deals. Ganguly notes that India's democratic openness, while a source of legitimacy, also introduces unpredictability into long-term strategic planning—a vulnerability that neighboring powers, with their centralized decision-making, rarely face. Economically, India's foreign policy has evolved in tandem with its rise as a \$3.7 trillion economy. Ganguly highlights how trade diplomacy, infrastructure partnerships, and digital connectivity have become central to India's influence projection. Initiatives like the International Solar Alliance, the Quad's infrastructure push, and bilateral defense production deals reflect a growing alignment between commerce and security. The government's emphasis on "friend-shoring" and "strategic autonomy" reveals a nuanced attempt to avoid dependency while leveraging global value chains. But as Ganguly cautions, India's economic weight—despite its size—remains underutilized in global institutions. The country's permanent membership in the UN Security Council remains contested, not out of lack of capability, but due to geopolitical rivalries, particularly within the G4 nuclear weapons states negotiations. From a military-diplomatic standpoint, Ganguly's analysis reveals a deliberate but cautious modernization. India's defense procurement has diversified beyond Russia to include the U.S., Israel, France, and Japan—reflecting a hedging strategy that avoids over-reliance. The India-U.S. defense partnership, elevated under the "Comprehensive Strategic Partnership," now includes joint exercises, technology sharing, and co-production—marking a shift from transactional cooperation to structural integration. Yet Ganguly underscores that India's defense diplomacy remains tempered by its historical aversion to military alliances. The reluctance to formalize security pacts, even with Quad partners, stems from a deep-seated desire to preserve strategic autonomy—a legacy of non-alignment, reinterpreted for the 21st century. Controversies have punctuated this evolution. The 2017 Doklam standoff with China exposed the limits of India's border diplomacy; the 2020 Galwan Valley clash revealed both the volatility of Sino-Indian relations and the challenges of military modernization. Ganguly provides a granular account of these events, emphasizing how they have forced a recalibration—not only in military posture but in diplomatic signaling. The establishment of the India-Maldives defense coordination, enhanced border infrastructure, and the development of the Chabahar Port in Iran are presented as measured responses that balance deterrence with regional engagement. In the realm of soft power, Ganguly's insights illuminate India's cultural and institutional outreach. The spread of Bharatanatyam, yoga, Bollywood, and digital content through platforms like Aacar and Swadesh reflects a deliberate effort to project influence beyond hard power. Yet Ganguly warns against overconfidence: while cultural diplomacy enhances India's global appeal, it does not substitute for strategic credibility. The disconnect between India's aspirational global image and its inconsistent policy outcomes—particularly in human rights, press freedom, and democratic backsliding—remains a critical vulnerability. Expert perspectives, as synthesized by Ganguly, reveal a consensus on India's trajectory: it is no longer a passive regional player, but a "networked power" operating across multiple domains—economic, technological, environmental, and security. Scholars like Ganguly argue that India's future foreign policy will hinge on its ability to reconcile this networked engagement with institutional coherence. The bureaucracy, still largely rooted in colonial-era structures, struggles to match the speed and complexity of contemporary diplomacy. The rise of a new generation of technocratic diplomats—trained in data analytics, cyber diplomacy, and climate negotiations—signals a necessary evolution. Yet, as Ganguly warns, India's geopolitical aspirations are constrained not just by external rivalries but by internal fragmentation. The federal structure, regional disparities, and identity-based politics create competing visions of India's global role. Will New Delhi pursue a

rules-based order as a normative leader, or adopt a more transactional, power-centric stance? The answer depends on whether India can cultivate a unified strategic culture—one that integrates economic ambition with democratic resilience and regional responsibility. Looking forward, Ganguly projects a multipolar Indo-Pacific where India plays a pivotal but not dominant role. The Quad, AUKUS, and BRICS+ will coexist in a complex ecosystem of alliances and rivalries. India's challenge lies in leveraging its demographic dividend, technological capacity, and diplomatic agility without succumbing to great power fatigue or domestic polarization. The country's ability to sustain its foreign policy evolution will depend on its institutional maturity, strategic clarity, and moral consistency. Sumit Ganguly's body of work stands as a definitive lens through which to understand India's foreign policy not as a static doctrine, but as a dynamic, contested, and evolving narrative—one shaped by history, driven by necessity, and tested by global turbulence. In an era where power is diffused and legitimacy is earned, India's journey offers a compelling case study of how a rising democracy navigates the paradox of strength and plurality. The next chapter of India's global story will not be written in grand declarations, but in the quiet calculus of diplomacy, the resilience of institutions, and the enduring tension between idealism and realpolitik. The implications extend beyond borders. As India asserts itself, it redefines what leadership means in the 21st century—challenging Western-centric models, amplifying Global South agency, and reconfiguring the architecture of global governance. Yet, for this vision to endure, it must confront its own contradictions: between sovereignty and partnership, between ambition and accountability, between regional primacy and global responsibility. Ganguly's analysis reminds us that foreign policy is ultimately a reflection of a nation's soul—its past, its present choices, and its courage to imagine a different future.
