In 2023, she co-founded **VoxGlobal**, a nonprofit supporting artists from underrepresented regions, providing grants, recording studios, and mentorship. As opera faces the dual challenges of relevance and representation, her trajectory offers a compelling blueprint: one where voice is not only heard, but honored as a vessel of truth, memory, and resistance.
