This harmonic grammar, codified in songbooks like *Hymns of Praise* (1920s), became the default for generations. Yet even then, subtle deviations emerged: the use of minor chords like Am in lamentations, or suspended voicings in prophetic calls, reflected deeper theological nuance. The post-WWII era marked a tectonic shift. As American gospel music crossed the Atlantic, it fused with Caribbean mento, Brazilian samba, and South African mbaqanga, generating hybrid forms.
