Whats My Favorite Questions to Ask: A Journalist's Discipline of Inquiry In the crucible of investigative journalism, where truth is not handed down but wrestled from layers of obfuscation, silence, and deliberate distortion, the choice of questions is not merely tactical—it is existential. The questions I return to are not random; they are calibrated instruments, forged in the crucible of history, shaped by the rhythms of power, and refined through decades of global upheaval. Each question carries a lineage—rooted in the failures of institutions, the fractures of economies, and the silent complicity of systems that thrive in opacity. These are not idle inquiries; they are diagnostic probes, designed to unravel the hidden architecture of influence, control, and decay. At the core of my methodology lies a profound understanding: the most powerful truths are not found in the spotlight, but in the margins—where whistleblowers hesitate, where data is cherry-picked, and where official narratives crack under scrutiny. My favorite questions emerge not from intuition alone, but from a deep sediment of geopolitical evolution, economic transformation, and technological disruption. They reflect a journalistic philosophy grounded in skepticism, empathy, and relentless contextualization.

The Origins: From Watergate to the Digital Age The lineage of my preferred questions begins in the American West, at the crucible of the 1970s. The Watergate scandal taught a generation of journalists that power, when unchecked, constructs elaborate façades to conceal its excesses. The question that haunted Bob Woodward and Carl Bernstein—“Who knows what, and who is protecting what?”—was not merely accusatory; it was diagnostic. It forced a reckoning with institutional secrecy, revealing how a network of covert operations and political patronage could operate beyond public accountability. This lineage evolved through the decades, shaped by global events: the Pentagon Papers, exposing the lies behind U.S. involvement in Vietnam; the Iran-Contra affair, revealing clandestine arms deals that circumvented Congress; and later, the Enron collapse, which laid bare the symbiosis between corporate greed and regulatory capture. Each case reinforced a critical insight: the most damaging truths are buried in layers of bureaucratic obfuscation, legal maneuvering, and economic complexity. By the 2000s, the digital revolution introduced a new terrain. The rise of mass data collection, algorithmic governance, and global financial networks transformed the landscape of accountability. The question that crystallized this shift was simple yet devastating: “Who controls the data, and what does it reveal about power?” This inquiry laid the foundation for the WikiLeaks revelations and the investigative work of journalists like Glenn Greenwald and Laura Poitras, who used encrypted channels and whistleblower protections to expose the machinery of surveillance and warfare.

The Evolution: From Transparency to Systemic Interrogation Today, the questions I return to reflect a world where transparency is no longer a default but a battleground. The global financial system, once opaque but navigable through expert analysis, now operates through layered offshore structures, shell companies, and digital currencies designed to evade scrutiny. The question that guides this era is not “What happened?” but “How did we allow this to become legal?” It demands dissection of regulatory loopholes, the role of law firms and banking institutions, and the political will—or lack thereof—to reform systems designed to serve the powerful. I trace this evolution through three interlocking domains: geopolitics, economics, and technology. Each domain demands distinct yet converging lines of inquiry. In geopolitics, the question “What are the hidden costs of alliance?” forces examination of military basing agreements, intelligence sharing, and the economic dependencies that bind nations in ways often invisible to the public. In economics, “How does value get displaced?” challenges the myth of fair markets, probing how tax havens, intellectual property regimes, and trade policies redistribute wealth across continents and classes. In technology, “What data is extracted, and who benefits?” exposes the invisible economy of attention, identity, and behavioral prediction that underpins modern power.

The Geopolitical Lens: Power Beyond the Visible At the geopolitical level, my favorite questions reject the illusion of state sovereignty as an absolute shield. They probe the invisible architecture of global influence: the networks of private military contractors operating in conflict zones, the diplomatic backchannels that shape regime change, and the economic instruments—sanctions, loans, trade embargoes—used not just to punish, but to engineer compliance. The question “Who funds the proxies?” is not just about money; it's about leverage. It unravels how states outsource violence, manipulate elections, and subsidize authoritarianism through opaque financial flows. Consider the case of Ukraine in the 2010s. Official narratives emphasized democratic resistance, but deeper inquiry required asking: “Which foreign actors finance the defense infrastructure, and what strategic interests do they advance?” This question led journalists to trace funding streams from Gulf states, Eastern European oligarchs, and Western private donors, revealing a complex web of influence that shaped both battlefield outcomes and post-war political realignments. This line of questioning is increasingly urgent amid the fragmentation of the post-Cold War order.

The rise of multipolarity has not led to greater transparency but to a patchwork of competing spheres of influence, each governed by its own rules. The question “What is the role of non-state actors in statecraft?” has become central—how private intelligence firms, cyber mercenaries, and digital propaganda networks now operate as force multipliers, often with tacit or explicit state backing. These actors thrive in legal gray zones, exploiting jurisdictional fragmentation. The answer lies not in seeking grand conspiracy theories, but in mapping the incremental erosion of accountability. For instance, the use of disinformation campaigns during the 2016 U.S. election was not a singular event but the culmination of decades of investment in psychological operations, amplified by social media algorithms designed to maximize engagement over truth. The question “How did disinformation become a weapon of state policy?” forces us to confront the institutionalization of manipulation—a paradigm shift that redefines the boundaries of warfare itself.

The Economic Framework: Value, Extraction, and Invisibility Economically, my most persistent question is “How is value generated, captured, and displaced?” This inquiry cuts through the veneer of market efficiency to expose the structural mechanisms of extraction. In the Global North, it reveals how multinational corporations use transfer pricing, intellectual property hoarding, and offshore tax structures to minimize liabilities, effectively shifting the burden onto labor and public services. In the Global South, it exposes how natural resources—oil, minerals, agricultural land—are appropriated through unequal contracts, corruption, and debt dependency, with profits siphoned away while local communities suffer environmental degradation and poverty. The rise of platform capitalism has further obscured these dynamics. Giants like Amazon, Meta, and Alphabet operate as invisible cartographers of behavior, monetizing attention through surveillance capitalism. The question “What data is being mined, and who controls its narrative?” is no longer about privacy—it’s about power. Control over data equates to control over influence, over consumer choices, and over political discourse. The revelations by whistleblowers like Frances Haugen, exposing internal research showing harmful effects of algorithmic amplification, confirm that these companies prioritize engagement and profit over societal well-being. This economic paradigm demands answers rooted in structural analysis, not moral condemnation. It requires tracing capital flows across jurisdictions, interrogating corporate governance, and understanding how regulatory capture enables impunity. The 2008 financial crisis, often framed as a failure of oversight, was in reality a systemic outcome of deregulation driven by lobbying, ideological shifts, and the financialization of the global economy. The question “What incentives reward recklessness?” leads to a deeper examination of compensation structures, risk externalization, and the political economy of deregulation.

The Technological Imperative: Data, Algorithms, and the Erosion of Agency Technology has redefined the terrain of inquiry. The question “What data is extracted, and what does it reveal about control?” has become central. In the era of big data, every click, location, and biometric signal becomes a node in a vast network of predictive modeling. Journalists must ask not only “Who collects it?” but “What inferences are drawn, and for what purpose?” The Cambridge Analytica scandal exemplified this shift: personal data, ostensibly about preferences, was mined to build psychographic profiles used to manipulate voter behavior at scale. Today, artificial intelligence amplifies these capabilities. Machine learning models process trillions of data points to forecast outcomes, personalize content, and automate decision-making—often without transparency or accountability. The question “How do algorithms shape reality?” challenges the assumption of neutrality in digital systems. Algorithms are not objective; they encode the values, biases, and priorities of their creators. Their deployment in policing, hiring, credit scoring, and content moderation entrenches inequality and suppresses dissent. Emerging technologies like generative AI further complicate the landscape. Deepfakes, synthetic media, and automated disinformation campaigns erode trust in information itself. The question “How do we distinguish truth from fabrication in an age of synthetic reality?” is no longer academic—it’s a survival imperative for democratic discourse. Journalists must not only debunk falsehoods but reconstruct frameworks for verification, using forensic tools, cross-referencing, and collaborative networks to counter the velocity and scalability of deception.

Expert Perspectives: Wisdom from the Frontlines To understand the depth of these questions, one must engage with those who live at their intersection. I have interviewed central bankers grappling with monetary policy in an era of debt infinity; whistleblowers risking exile to expose corporate and state abuses; and technologists warning of algorithmic authoritarianism. Their insights converge on a critical insight: truth is not a destination but a process—one that demands patience, precision, and persistence. Economist Ha-Joon Chang, for instance, underscores how the neoliberal consensus has been sustained not by market efficiency but by state intervention masked as freedom. His work reframes the question of economic justice not as a moral debate but as a structural challenge rooted in power asymmetries. Similarly, cybersecurity expert Bruce Schneier emphasizes that data is not just information—it is a form of power, and its protection requires institutional vigilance, not just technical fixes. In the realm of surveillance and digital rights, Shoshana Zuboff’s concept of “surveillance capitalism” provides a lens to understand how behavior itself has become a commodity. Her work reveals that the erosion of privacy is not incidental but systemic, driven by profit motives that outpace democratic oversight. These expert voices reinforce the necessity of asking not only “What is happening?” but “Why is it allowed, and who benefits?”

Controversies and Risks: The Journalist’s Peril Asking these questions carries profound risks. Journalists who pursue transparency in opaque systems face retaliation: legal intimidation, cyberattacks, smear campaigns, and in extreme cases, physical danger. The murder of Jamal Khashoggi, the surveillance of reporters through tools like Pegasus, and the criminalization of whistleblowing illustrate the stakes.

Yet, it is precisely this danger that underscores the importance of these inquiries. The willingness to confront power, even at personal cost, defines the integrity of investigative journalism. Economically, powerful actors resist transparency not out of luck, but out of necessity. When investigations threaten entrenched interests—whether in fossil fuel, finance, or digital monopolies—the response is often coordinated: discrediting sources, funding counter-narratives, and leveraging legal systems to silence dissent. This dynamic reveals a deeper truth: accountability is not granted; it is seized through relentless pursuit. Globally, the response varies. In democracies with strong press freedoms, these questions are debated in public forums, though often diluted by political expediency. In authoritarian contexts, they are suppressed, but underground networks of journalists, coders, and activists continue to push boundaries, often at life's cost. The case of Maria Ressa in the Philippines—awarded a Nobel Peace Prize for her defense of press freedom—epitomizes this struggle: her work exposing state-linked disinformation campaigns highlights how truth-telling becomes an act of resistance.

Global Comparisons: Divergent Paths of Accountability The capacity to answer these questions varies dramatically across regions, shaped by political culture, institutional strength, and historical memory. In Scandinavia, robust public broadcasting, strong rule of law, and a tradition of transparency enable deeper scrutiny. Investigative outlets like Sweden's **Dagens Nyheter** or Norway's **Verdens Gang** operate with institutional backing, allowing sustained inquiry into corruption, environmental crime, and human rights abuses. In contrast, many emerging democracies face systemic challenges: weak rule of law, under-resourced media, and political interference. In India, for example, investigative journalists like Rana Ayyad and Grist's Nick Paton Walsh navigate intense pressure, defamation lawsuits, and surveillance, even as they expose electoral fraud, communal violence, and state overreach. Their work reveals a paradox: while digital connectivity expands reach, it also concentrates surveillance capabilities in the hands of the state and corporate actors. In China, the state's control over information is near-total, though independent voices persist in exile or through encrypted channels. The case of Zhang Zhan, a citizen journalist imprisoned for documenting the early COVID-19 outbreak, exemplifies the extreme risks in environments where truth challenges official narratives. Yet, even here, digital footprints persist—data leaks, anonymous disclosures, and international collaborations keep alternative narratives alive. These comparisons underscore that accountability is not universal; it is contingent on institutional architecture and civic courage. The global variation in journalistic freedom reflects deeper societal values—between openness and control, transparency and secrecy.

Future Projections: The Next Frontier of Inquiry Looking ahead, the questions I return to must evolve with the challenges. Climate breakdown demands a new set of inquiries: “How is climate risk being misrepresented for profit?” “Who funds the fossil fuel disinformation ecosystem?” “What data informs climate adaptation policies, and who controls it?” The answer lies in tracing carbon accounting, corporate lobbying, and the role of financial institutions in greenwashing. In the domain of artificial intelligence, the central question shifts to: “How do we ensure algorithmic accountability?” This requires not just technical audits but legal frameworks mandating transparency, bias testing, and redress mechanisms. Journalists must partner with technologists to decode black-box
