The Major Arcana, for instance, reimagines key figures not as European archetypes but as embodied symbols of African diasporic experience. The Fool is not a carefree wanderer but a figure emerging from the charnel ground of ancestral memory—his red hat a reversal of colonial power's blood-stained fabric. The Magician,

typically associated with mastery, is depicted with hands rooted in soil, holding a crude but potent talisman; his wand is a staff carved with loa symbols—Legba’s crossroads, Erzulie’s flowing hair, Ya — rather than a traditional staff of authority. The High Priestess does not sit in silence but stands at the edge of a swamp, her veil drawn back to reveal a dragon coiled in the background, her voice a whisper of forgotten prayers. Each card’s imagery draws from a deep well of Afro-Caribbean symbolism, but filtered through New Orleans’ specific geography and spiritual ecology. The Chariot, for example, is not a triumphant chariot pulled by horses, but one drawn by spectral mules—creatures of the bayou, embodying both burden and liberation. The Strength (often the lion) is replaced by a figure shrouded in shadow, her form fluid between panther and spirit, reflecting the fluid identities forged in the city’s margins. Even the suit distinctions shift: The Pentacles become **hearth symbols**—jars of gumbo, rusted pots, weathered tools—each representing not wealth but sustenance, memory, and the labor of survival. The Cups are not romantic scenes but ritual vessels filled with water from the Mississippi, blood from ancestral graves, or tears of the displaced. This reimagining is not arbitrary.
