Economist Dr. Thomas Kamwendo, writing in the

, emphasizes the statistical weight of voter behavior: “The 2025 results reveal a cohort of voters who prioritized governance quality over party loyalty—a shift akin to the 2019 Kenyan recalibration, but with sharper generational and digital dimensions.” He highlights a 34% increase in first-time voters

under 30, many activated through social media campaigns focused on corruption and unemployment. Yet Kamwendo warns of a “democratic fatigue”: repeated crises have eroded trust in institutions, even as participation rose. Legal analyst Professor Linda Kachale stresses the judiciary’s evolving role. “The Constitutional Court’s interventions in 2020 set a new precedent,” she notes. “In 2025, while the MEC managed to overcome technical flaws, the judiciary’s vigilance ensured that the process remained anchored in rule of law—something absent in earlier transitions.” This institutional strengthening, she argues, positions Malawi to become a regional model for electoral integrity. **Controversies and Risks: The Shadow of Fraud and Polarization** No “Maneb result” is complete without confronting the specter of electoral integrity.
