Plath's father, in the poem, is not only a personal figure but a cipher for the authoritarian state—its bureaucratic cruelty, its erasure of individuality. The Nazi imagery is deliberate: Otto's German heritage, his academic rationality, and his emotional coldness are refracted through a lens that conflates personal and historical trauma. This layering resonates with the era's broader reckoning with fascism's legacy, particularly in Europe, where Plath's family—German by birth—was both culturally embedded and symbolically suspect in post-war American discourse. The poem thus becomes a transnational palimpsest: personal grief inscribed with the scars of geopolitical violence. Economically, Plath's position as a woman writer in a male-dominated literary industry amplified the stakes of her poetic voice. During the 1950s and early 1960s, women's contributions to
