In retail, it powers personalized marketing—scanning a code to unlock discounts, but only after a user confirms their identity or intent, reducing accidental clicks. In healthcare, the QR code became a frontline tool during the pandemic. Governments and clinics deployed manual entry for digital check-ins, vaccine records, and symptom logs.
