By the 19th century, with the rise of mass print media and the proliferation of newspapers, **El Diablo Ilustrado** evolved into a more recognizable form. In Peru’s 2022 political turmoil, digital illustrators depicted a figure with a suit and a hydra, each head a former president, symbolizing institutional decay. This global resonance reveals a shared structural vulnerability
