By standardizing this language at the secondary level, policymakers aimed to reduce fragmentation and strengthen national integration—especially vital during a period when Nepal's sovereignty was frequently contested by its powerful neighbors, India and China.

Economic Foundations and the Curriculum's Industrial Logic

The relationship between education policy and economic development is starkly visible in the Class 10 Nepali guide. strategic—validating marginalized voices while containing them within a national framework.

Geopolitical Pressures and the Language Question

Nepal's linguistic landscape is one of the most complex in South Asia, with over 120 languages and dialects. Geopolitically, Nepal's curriculum reforms will reflect shifting regional alliances. India's growing influence in education—through scholarships, digital platforms, and curriculum exchanges—pressures Nepal to modernize. Simultaneously, China's Belt and Road Initiative opens channels for alternative pedagogical models, including Mandarin-language integration in border regions.
