Yet its reputation waned in Western biomedicine by the early 20th century, dismissed as unscientific and anecdotal. The resurgence began not through academic endorsement but through spectacle. In 2015, LeBron James' visibly

bruised back after a game, paired with viral footage of cupping on social media, ignited a global fascination. Celebrities, athletes, and influencers followed, transforming cupping from niche Eastern practice into a symbol of wellness aristocracy. This cultural inflection point coincided with a broader skepticism toward pharmaceuticals and obesity treatments, creating fertile ground for alternative therapies promising natural, non-invasive solutions. But the surge in popularity outpaced rigorous validation. While anecdotal reports praised reduced bloating and flatter silhouettes, clinical data remained sparse and often contradictory. A 2018 Cochrane review concluded that cupping showed “modest” short-term reductions in waist circumference—averaging 1-3 cm less than placebo over 4-12 weeks—yet emphasized methodological flaws: small sample sizes, inconsistent cup pressure, duration, and control groups. The therapy’s mechanism, though intuitively tied to localized blood flow, lymphatic drainage, and myofascial release, lacked conclusive physiological mapping. State-backed initiatives promote TCM globally through Belt and Road cultural programs, embedding cupping in international wellness hubs from Singapore to Berlin. Meanwhile, Gulf states like the UAE and Saudi Arabia have institutionalized *hijama* clinics, integrating it into national health strategies amid rising diabetes and metabolic syndrome rates. In the West, private clinics in cities like Los Angeles, London, and Tokyo market cupping as premium aesthetic and metabolic therapy, often bundled with massage, hot stone, and detox programs. The market, estimated at \$2.3 billion in 2023, is projected to grow at 11.2% CAGR through 2030, driven by demand for “non-drug” interventions and aging populations seeking non-invasive body sculpting. Yet this technological infusion risks distancing the practice from its tactile, embodied origins, transforming a human-centered ritual into a data-optimized intervention.
