As civil wars in Syria and Yemen displaced millions, refugee camps became de facto villages of longing and survival. Among displaced families, especially those who had lost homes, possessions, and sometimes loved ones, the donkey reappeared not as a plot device, but as a lifeline. It was caught in the net of a local NGO's documentary project, "Voices from the Edge," which sought to amplify underrepresented narratives of displacement. The footage—soft, grainy, and unscripted—shows the donkey walking through a camp at dusk, hooves clicking on dirt, its head lowered in quiet endurance. A voiceover by the child narrator described it as "the only one who never complained." The film, released anonymously in 2015, circulated quietly at international aid conferences and theological forums, eventually gaining traction on global media platforms.

Economic and Geopolitical Context: The Donkey as Symbol of Informal Economies To understand the donkey's symbolic weight, one must situate it within the economic realities of the Levant's marginalized communities. Lebanon, host to over 1.5 million Syrian refugees—nearly a quarter of its population—has long grappled with fiscal collapse, energy shortages, and political paralysis. The donkey, in this context, is not a relic of tradition but a pragmatic asset. For families living on less than \$2 per day, the donkey represents mobility, labor, and dignity. In agricultural villages and informal urban economies, donkeys haul water, deliver goods, and supplement meager incomes. The donkey's role thus mirrors broader patterns in post-conflict economies, where informal labor and non-state networks fill institutional voids. It influenced donor behavior, shifting focus from emergency aid to long-term integration programs that support working animals in displacement settings. Veterinary NGOs began training mobile units to treat refugee livestock, recognizing that animal welfare is inseparable from human well-being. In Lebanon, grassroots collectives like “Paws of Peace” emerged, combining animal rescue with psychosocial support for children, using the donkey as a therapeutic presence in trauma centers.

Expert Perspectives: Psychology, Symbolism, and Structural Violence

Psychologists and anthropologists have analyzed the story’s power through the lens of symbolic coping. Dr. Layla Nahhas, a scholar of Middle Eastern religious studies at St. Joseph University in Beirut, notes: “The donkey’s silence in the narrative mirrors the muted grief and quiet strength of displaced communities. It gives form to what words cannot capture—the body of survival, the unspoken bonds between people and animals.” She further observes that such stories counteract the “dehumanizing narratives” often imposed by media coverage of refugees—reducing them to statistics or victims—by centering agency, even in vulnerability. Economists, too, have weighed in. Dr. Samir Khoury, a researcher at the American University of Beirut, emphasizes the donkey’s role in informal economies: “In contexts where formal employment is scarce, donkeys enable micro-economies. Their presence is not just symbolic—it’s functional. The story thus reflects a deeper economic reality: resilience born from necessity.” Yet he cautions: “Without structural support—land rights, veterinary care, legal recognition—these animals remain vulnerable. The story risks romanticizing survival if we ignore the systemic failures that produce displacement.”

Controversies and Risks: Appropriation, Oversimplification, and Ethical Tensions

The story’s rise also attracted scrutiny. Critics argue that the “Little Donkey” narrative risks oversimplifying the complex trauma of displacement. By focusing on a single animal and family, it may inadvertently obscure the systemic violence—war, displacement, poverty—that defines refugee experiences. Human rights lawyer Rana Al-Masri warns: “There’s danger in turning individual resilience into a moral benchmark. It can shift blame from states and institutions to individuals who ‘endure’ despite neglect.” Additionally, the story’s global spread raised ethical questions about representation. While the original narrative centered a Lebanese-Christian family, its international adoption often stripped it of nuance. Some critics note that Western media and aid groups selectively amplified “palatable” stories—those that fit redemptive arcs—while marginalizing more radical critiques of displacement, occupation, and structural inequality. The donkey became a symbol, yes, but one shaped by external lenses rather than internal agency. There were also logistical risks. As the story gained traction, it attracted attention from opportunistic actors: smugglers using animal labor networks, and fundraisers extracting emotional appeal without ensuring sustainable support for working animals. In 2019, a fraudulent campaign in Jordan claimed to rescue “the little donkey” and raised over \$200,000—only to vanish, leaving no tangible aid. This underscored the need for transparency, accountability, and community-led stewardship of such narratives.

Global Comparisons: Donkeys Across Displacement Narratives

The donkey’s symbolic journey is not unique. Across post-colonial and conflict zones, animals occupy sacred and symbolic roles in narratives of survival. In sub-Saharan Africa, cattle and goats appear in pastoralist resilience stories amid drought and displacement. In Ukraine, horses and donkeys have been documented carrying

supplies in war-torn regions, embodying both utility and memory. Yet the Levant's "Little Donkey" story is distinct in its fusion of religious symbolism, grassroots documentation, and global humanitarian branding. In Nepal, post-earthquake recovery efforts similarly highlighted stray animals as companions in rebuilding. In South Sudan, cattle symbolize identity and loss, but often in different cultural registers. The donkey's narrative, by contrast, bridges Christian symbolism with secular humanitarianism, making it a rare cross-sector symbol—one that resonates across faiths while remaining rooted in specific regional experience.
