Yet beneath the commercial veneer lies a complex web of geopolitical negotiation. In post-Soviet states, for example, the revival of Christmas has been both a cultural reclamation and a subtle act of resistance. Under Soviet rule, Orthodox Christmas (January 7) was marginalized, suppressed in favor of state-enforced atheism. Since the 1990s, its resurgence has paralleled the rise of Russian national identity, with state-sanctioned celebrations emphasizing family, faith, and tradition—often conflating Christmas with New Year’s to reinforce state narratives of continuity and resilience. Similarly, in Israel, Christmas in Palestinian communities coexists uneasily with Easter in Christian-majority areas, reflecting deeper tensions of occupation, sovereignty, and cultural coexistence. Policy analysts warn of over-commercialization eroding its spiritual essence, advocating for
