Conversely, during the Cold War, **Human Action** found unexpected resonance in the West, not as a policy manual but as a philosophical defense of individual liberty against collectivist coercion. Thinkers like Friedrich Hayek, though distinct in emphasis, shared Mises's skepticism of centralized planning, helping to revive classical liberal thought through institutions like the Mont Pelerin Society, founded in 1947. Mises's influence permeated the intellectual foundations of neoliberalism, though his rigor and consistency often stood in tension with its more pragmatic adaptations. Yet Mises's legacy is not without controversy. Critics argue his praxeology is too abstract, his rejection of empirical testing undermines scientific credibility, and his moral framing of markets risks neglecting structural inequalities. Some accuse him of underestimating power dynamics, assuming a level playing field where information asymmetries and institutional inertia profoundly shape outcomes. Others, particularly post-Keynesians and institutional economists, challenge his time-preference theory, citing behavioral deviations from rational choice, though Mises would counter that such "irrationalities" are themselves purposeful responses to context. Moreover, his staunch opposition to interventionism has been scrutinized in light of market failures—environmental degradation, public health crises—where collective action often necessitates coordinated state response, complicating the laissez-faire ideal. Geopolitically, Mises's framework offers a lens to interpret enduring global tensions. The rise of state capitalism in China, the welfare-state expansions in Europe, and the populist backlash against globalization all reflect the unresolved tension between individual agency and systemic control. In emerging economies, his warning against monetary manipulation resonates amid recurring currency crises and debt dependency, while in advanced democracies, his emphasis on purposeful action challenges

algorithmic governance and behavioral nudging that subtly erode autonomy. His insights into entrepreneurship as a disruptive, creative force remain vital in assessing innovation ecosystems, particularly in contexts where state-led development stifles initiative. Expert perspectives on Mises reveal a spectrum of admiration and debate. Economist Israel Kirzner, a prominent Austrian scholar, lauds Mises for recovering the entrepreneur's role as market discoverer, though he critiques the static nature of praxeology. Philosopher Michael Sandel, while not an economist, echoes Mises's concern: that liberal societies increasingly treat individuals as mere means to collective ends, undermining the moral foundation of choice. Historian Niall Ferguson acknowledges Mises's prescience in diagnosing central banking's risks, yet notes the necessity of regulated markets to correct externalities—a synthesis Mises, skeptical of intervention, might resist. Meanwhile, behavioral economists like Dan Ariely concede subjective value's primacy but argue that cognitive biases require institutional safeguards absent in Mises's idealized model. The risks inherent in Mises's framework stem not from its logic, but from its application. When reduced to ideological dogma—advocating unregulated markets without social safety nets or democratic accountability—his ideas can justify inequality and neglect systemic vulnerabilities. Yet when engaged with humility, praxeology offers a powerful corrective: it reminds us that no model, no statistic, can fully capture the complexity of human choice. Markets are not perfect, but they aggregate dispersed knowledge through prices—an emergent order born from countless individual decisions. Mises's insistence on purposeful action grounds economics in lived reality, resisting the reduction of humans to mere data points. Globally, comparative analysis reveals both parallels and divergences. In China, state-directed investment drives growth but suppresses entrepreneurial autonomy, echoing Mises's warnings about planning without prices. In Scandinavia, high-tax, high-welfare systems expand freedom in consumption and security in existence, yet face criticism for dampening market dynamism—tensions Mises might frame as trade-offs between collective provision and individual calculation. In Africa and South Asia, informal economies thrive precisely because formal markets fail to accommodate subjective needs, affirming Mises's insight that price signals reflect lived experience, not abstract models. These cross-contextual tests validate his core claim: economic systems must preserve the entrepreneur's role as purposeful agent, lest they become instruments of control rather than empowerment. Looking ahead, Mises's **Human Action** offers vital strategic insight for navigating 21st-century challenges. In an era of artificial intelligence, where algorithms increasingly shape choice architecture, his emphasis on human agency becomes urgent. Can markets retain meaning when decisions are automated, optimized by black-box systems? Mises would urge vigilance: technology must serve purpose, not replace it. His framework demands that we design systems enhancing individual calculation, not subsuming it—preserving transparency, accountability, and the irreducible subjectivity of value. Climate change further tests his legacy. Mises's focus on time and capital allocation illuminates the urgency of intergenerational calculation: markets, left unguided, often discount future costs, yet environmental degradation demands long-term calculation. While Mises did not address climate explicitly, his praxeology supports mechanisms—like carbon pricing—that internalize long-term consequences, aligning individual incentives with collective survival. Yet he would caution against top-down mandates that bypass decentralized knowledge, arguing that local, knowledge-rich actors remain best positioned to respond dynamically to ecological shifts. Demographic shifts—aging populations, migration flows—compound the complexity Mises sought to clarify. How do diverse values and preferences interact in pluralistic societies? Mises's individualism implies that social cohesion emerges not from imposed norms, but from
