The geopolitical context of this shift cannot be

overstated. The collapse of Soviet communism in 1991 removed not just a political rival but a competing cosmic framework—one that had once offered a teleological narrative of historical struggle. Without that external dialectic, the internal crisis of meaning accelerated. The 1990s saw the first waves of globalization’s discontents: the erosion of manufacturing jobs, the rise of financial speculation, and the intensification of cultural alienation. In the U.S., the Reaganite faith in markets as moral forces unraveled alongside the stock market crash of 1987 and the Lehman Brothers collapse in 2008. In Europe, the Maastricht Treaty and the euro’s birth signaled deeper integration but also a dilution of national sovereignty— weitere erosion of the “Gods” of nationhood. Coupland’s work, though rooted in North American experience, resonated globally because it articulated a universal anxiety: the loss of transcendent purpose. In Japan, where *Generation X* found early resonance among disaffected urban youth, the collapse of the post-war economic miracle mirrored Western disillusionment. The “salaryman” ethos, once a pillar of identity, crumbled under the weight of overwork, debt, and demographic decline. Similarly, in post-Soviet states, the collapse of state socialism left a vacuum filled not by liberal utopias

but by raw economic hardship and spiritual disorientation. Here, Coupland's themes found fertile ground—individuals redefining purpose without the narrative glue of ideology or religion. The economic transformation that followed Coupland's original diagnosis reshaped the terrain of meaning. The rise of platform capitalism, algorithmic labor, and the gig economy redefined work itself. Traditional career ladders dissolved into a patchwork of short-term gigs, freelance projects, and portfolio careers. This economic fluidity, while offering autonomy, deepened precarity. The "God" of stability—steady employment, upward mobility—was replaced by a myth of constant reinvention. Yet this reinvention was not liberation; it was a performance of self-optimization, a neoliberal gospel in itself. As sociologist Byung-Chul Han argues in **The Burnout Society**, the modern individual is not oppressed by external force but driven by internalized productivity demands—a spiritual discipline without divine sanction. In this context, Coupland's legacy lies in his early recognition of what became systemic: the substitution of economic and technological progress for spiritual meaning. Where Coupland saw disillusionment, later thinkers saw a reconfiguration. The "spiritual but not religious" movement, the rise of mindfulness and secular Buddhism, and the

popularity of narrative therapy all reflect attempts to reconstruct meaning outside institutional religion. Yet these responses often reproduce the very individualism that Coupland diagnosed. The self becomes both architect and prisoner, curating identity like a portfolio while feeling increasingly unmoored. Globally, the post-Coupland era has seen divergent trajectories. In the Global South, where economic growth has outpaced institutional decay, faith-based systems—both traditional and revivalist—have often stepped in to fill the void. In India, for instance, the resurgence of Hindu nationalism and the viral spread of digital gurus on platforms like YouTube offer alternative mythologies, blending ancient symbolism with modern charisma. In Latin America, liberation theology's decline has been offset by grassroots movements rooted in ecological justice and community solidarity—echoes of pre-capitalist communalisms reimagined for the digital age. These are not rejections of Coupland's insight but adaptations to it, where meaning is sought not in disillusionment but in reconnection—with history, with place, with collective struggle. The digital revolution has further complicated the landscape. Social media, once hailed as a democratizing force, has become a double-edged sword. On one hand, it

provides unprecedented access to diverse worldviews, enabling polyphonic self-expression. On the other, it fosters hyper-individualism and fragmented attention, where validation is fleeting and identity performative. The “God” of Coupland—transcendent, elusive—has been replaced by a cacophony of influencers, algorithms, and viral trends, each vying for attention in a saturated attention economy. Neuroscientific research confirms that constant digital feedback loops rewire the brain’s reward system, reinforcing the very fragmentation Coupland observed: a culture addicted to instant gratification, where deep meaning competes with dopamine hits. Experts across disciplines have grappled with these shifts. Anthropologist Arjun Appadurai’s concept of the “scapes”—ethnoscapes, mediascapes, technoscapes—provides a framework for understanding the fluid, disorienting world where identities are no longer rooted but routed through networks. Philosopher Byung-Chul Han’s critique of the “open society” as a site of self-exploitation resonates deeply: freedom, once seen as liberation, becomes burdened by endless self-optimization. Meanwhile, psychologist Jean Twenge’s longitudinal studies link rising rates of anxiety and depression among Gen Z and younger millennials to the erosion

of stable meaning structures—a generational trauma rooted in Coupland’s original diagnosis. Coupland himself evolved as a thinker beyond *Generation X*. His later works, including *What Is Culture?* and *Tribe*, explore how culture itself becomes a site of negotiation—between tradition and innovation, individualism and community. He came to see meaning not as lost but reconstituted in new forms: in grassroots activism, in digital storytelling, in shared rituals of sustainability and resistance. This reframing is critical: life after God is not a void but a creative rupture, where meaning is no longer handed down but co-created. Yet risks persist. The absence of a shared moral framework, while liberating in its pluralism, also enables polarization and nihilism. The rise of authoritarian populism, climate despair, and mental health crises reflect the human cost of meaning’s erosion. In the U.S., the 2016 election and subsequent cultural wars revealed a society split not just politically but existentially—between those clinging to legacy narratives and those forging new ones. In Europe, the refugee crisis and Brexit exposed the fragility of national identity in an interconnected world. These tensions are not new, but their intensity is amplified by Coupland’s legacy: the world no longer assumes meaning; it must be earned,

negotiated, and often rebuilt. Economically, the post-Coupland era has seen both innovation and instability. The tech boom of the 2010s promised a new frontier of meaning through innovation and disruption. Yet today's "techlash" reveals disillusionment with unchecked growth and surveillance capitalism. The gig economy, initially seen as freedom's promise, now faces regulatory backlash and worker organizing—signaling a demand for dignity and stability beyond pure productivity. Meanwhile, the climate crisis has forced a reckoning: meaning is no longer just personal but planetary. Movements like Extinction Rebellion and Fridays for Future articulate a sacred duty to future generations—a secular spirituality born of ecological urgency. Expert projections vary. Sociologist Zygmunt Bauman's "liquid modernity" remains prescient: a world where identities, relationships, and even nations are in constant flux. Yet others, like futurologist Ray Kurzweil, foresee a post-human future where AI augments or replaces human meaning-making. More skeptical, thinkers like Sherry Turkle warn of a "alone together" condition, where digital connection deepens isolation. In this uncertainty, Coupland's insight endures: meaning is not given but made, in community, in practice, in

resistance. The long-term implications hinge on how societies navigate this transition. The global South, often excluded from Western-centric narratives, offers alternative models—communal resilience, spiritual pluralism, ecological harmony—that challenge the individualist paradigm Coupland identified. In Scandinavia, universal welfare and strong social contracts buffer existential anxiety. In Indigenous movements worldwide, decolonization and land-based knowledge revive pre-modern wisdom as a source of meaning. These are not retreats but re-imaginings—proof that life after God can be plural, embodied, and deeply relational. For the individual, the task is not to return to lost certainties but to cultivate what philosopher Charles Taylor calls “strong evaluations”—a sense of meaning grounded in personal integrity, ethical commitment, and connection. This requires a cultural shift: from a performance economy to a care economy, from extraction to regeneration. Education systems, workplaces, and public spaces must evolve to nurture reflection, empathy, and collective responsibility. As Coupland once wrote, “The sacred is not dead—it has just changed mask.” Looking ahead, the next chapter of life after God will be shaped by three forces: technological acceleration, ecological reckoning, and

the resurgence of local meaning. Artificial intelligence will redefine creativity and agency, demanding new ethical frameworks. Climate collapse will force a redefinition of progress, one rooted in sustainability rather than growth. And communities—whether virtual or physical—will become the new temples where meaning is forged. In this evolving landscape, Douglas Coupland’s legacy is not a diagnosis of despair but a call to awareness. He saw the end of God not as a tragedy but as a threshold: the moment when humanity must finally answer the question that had been deferred for centuries. The answer is not singular. It is plural, contingent, and collective. Life after God is not the absence of meaning, but its transformation—into something that demands not faith, but presence; not certainty, but curiosity; not isolation, but belonging. And in that transformation, there remains hope: not in a new god, but in the courage to build meaning, together.
