This divergence reflects broader societal values: collectivism, equity, and long-term human capital development versus individual competition and credential signaling. In emerging economies, particularly in parts of Asia, the business final exam assumes near-mythic weight. China's Gaokao system, though primarily university-admissions focused, exerts a de facto final exam effect in business and economics faculties. Its intense national scale reinforces meritocratic ideals but

exacts a profound personal toll, sparking debates over mental health and over-education. These comparisons underscore a universal tension: how to design assessments that are both rigorous and just—capable of identifying talent while avoiding the reproduction of inequality.

Long-Term Implications: The Future of Business Education and Credentialing
