In multicultural classrooms, this raises urgent questions: whose metaphors are normalized? Whose experiences are rendered invisible through linguistic framing? Educators in Canada and South Africa have responded by incorporating indigenous storytelling frameworks—where personification of nature or ancestral voice is central—into figurative language instruction, challenging monolithic rhetorical traditions and fostering inclusive literacy. Economically, the framing of figurative language also reflects broader labor market transformations. In an era where emotional intelligence, narrative competence, and creative problem-solving are increasingly valued—especially in knowledge economies—educators position metaphor and narrative as foundational for innovation. McKinsey’s 2023 report on future skills identifies “complex problem solving” and “critical thinking” as top competencies, skills inherently nurtured through metaphorical reasoning. Employers seek workers who can reframe challenges, inspire through storytelling, and navigate ambiguity—all competencies cultivated in classrooms where students learn to “think in metaphors.” Yet, the
