Television networks like Televisa and TV Azteca rarely broadcast programming in Nahuatl or Maya, despite constitutional recognition. This gap reinforces linguistic

hierarchies: advertisers target Spanish speakers, policymakers draft legislation in Castilian, and cultural production remains concentrated in dominant linguistic arenas. However, emerging markets in bilingual content—such as streaming services offering Nahuatl-dubbed series or educational platforms in Otomi—signal potential transformation. The Mexican government’s *Programa Nacional de Lenguas Indígenas 2021–2030* allocates funding for media in native languages, a move hailed by activists but criticized by linguists for insufficient scale and enforcement. Expert perspectives reveal a field in intellectual ferment. Dr. Elena Ruiz, a sociolinguist at UNAM’s Institute of Mexican Languages, emphasizes that language loss is not inevitable but a consequence of structural neglect.
