In Iran, for example, state-backed crypto casinos offer 'regulated' gambling with biometric login and transaction tracking—rendering the line between freedom and control increasingly porous.

The Industry's Evolution: From Platforms to Ecosystems Harrington's analysis reveals that online cash games are no longer isolated gambling sites. They are evolving into complex ecosystems integrating DeFi (decentralized finance), NFT-based assets, and social gaming. Yet, this evolution is not without structural vulnerabilities.
