Here, linguistic excellence is both cultural aspiration and economic prerequisite, reflecting a society where language mastery signals social mobility. The U.S. model, shaped by decentralized governance, varies widely. States like California emphasize project-based vocabulary learning, while others rely on outdated drill-based tests. International assessments like PISA and TIMSS highlight these disparities, showing that nations with integrated, context-rich language instruction outperform those fixated on rote memorization.

Long-Term Implications: Shaping Futures and Redefining Literacy
