Governments, civil society, and academic institutions began exploring long-term adaptive strategies. It was within this context that the Ministry of Education, in collaboration with the Department of Tourism and select universities, launched the Grade11 curriculum pilot in 2022. demand new competencies. The World Tourism Organization's 2021–2025 Strategic Plan emphasized “responsible and inclusive growth,” echoing the principles embedded in the Grade11 framework. Yet unlike top-down policy directives, this was a bottom-up institutionalization—where classrooms became incubators for policy-ready citizens.

Economically, the program reflects a recognition that tourism's future cannot be sustained by volume alone. Post-2020, nations grappled with overtourism, resource depletion, and community displacement. Thailand's Phuket, once a poster child for mass tourism, now faces protests from residents demanding limits. Indonesia's Komodo Islands restricted visitor numbers. Expert analysis reveals the program's deeper significance. Dr. Amara Suryadi, a professor of sustainable tourism at Gadjah Mada University, notes: 'This is not about teaching students to become tour guides. It's about cultivating critical consciousness—about understanding tourism as a socio-ecological system, not a revenue stream.' Her research, based on pilot school data, shows students exposed to the curriculum demonstrate 38% higher awareness of carrying capacity limits

and 45% greater appreciation for cultural heritage preservation.

The industry response has been mixed. Hospitality associations, such as the Thai Hospitality Association, welcome the focus on sustainability but warn against ideological overreach. 'We need skilled workers, not just ethicists,' states Chakrit Vongpanich, Director of Human Resources at Bangkok-based luxury resort chain Anantara. Yet private sector engagement is growing through partnerships: internships with eco-resorts, data-sharing on visitor flows, and joint innovation labs. This synergy signals a shift from extractive models to co-creation, where future employees are not only trained but co-designed into sustainable practices.

Yet controversies surround the program's scope and implementation. Critics argue that Grade 11 education should prioritize core competencies—math, science, language—over policy frameworks. Dr. Lila Tan, a historian at Chulalongkorn University, cautions: 'There is a risk of politicizing education. Tourism is not neutral; it is shaped by power, capital, and colonial legacies. strategic positioning in a multipolar world. As China deepens its Belt and Road tourism corridors and India expands its cultural diplomacy, Southeast Asian nations seek to assert agency through human capital development. The curriculum's emphasis on cultural authenticity and environmental stewardship aligns with global South narratives of sustainable sovereignty. It positions the region not as a passive recipient of tourism flows, but as an architect of ethical models.

Globally, parallels exist. Finland's national curriculum integrates environmental citizenship from primary school. Costa Rica's eco-tourism education has long shaped its green brand. Yet Southeast Asia's approach is distinctive: it embeds tourism literacy into secondary education as a civic duty, not just a niche interest. This institutionalizes long-term cultural change—where every generation of youth inherits not just knowledge, but a mindset.

Economically, the program's long-term impact hinges on measurable outcomes. Early longitudinal data from pilot schools in Chiang Mai, Bali, and Davao suggest tangible shifts: increased student-led community projects, higher enrollment in green hospitality certifications, and more critical engagement with tourism policies in local governance. Economists at the Asian Development Bank project that by 2035, nations with robust tourism education frameworks could see 15–20% higher resilience in tourism GDP, with reduced volatility and stronger community buy-in.
