Goldilocks, in this context, becomes a metaphor not just for intrusion, but for cultural sovereignty—how stories are owned, adapted, and disseminated.

## **Industry Impact: From Children’s Literature to Cybersecurity Discourse**

The fable’s influence extends beyond literature into France’s cybersecurity and privacy sectors. In 2019, the \*Agence nationale de la sécurité des systèmes d’information\* (ANSSI) referenced Goldilocks in internal training modules on social engineering.
